

This year's featured women are:

Dr. Carolyn Meltzer and Dr. Rogsbert Phillips



Dr. Meltzer is well known for her expertise in translational imaging methods, including leading the clinical evaluation of the world's first PET/CT scanner. She is currently the William P. Timmie Professor and Chair of Radiology and Imaging Sciences, and Associate Dean of Research at Emory University School of Medicine.

Dr. Phillips is a general surgeon and fellow of the American College of Surgeons specializing in breast surgery. She graduated from Columbia University School of Medicine in 1977 and in 1982 became the second woman and first African-American woman to successfully complete Emory University's surgical program.
